

Poet John Ashbery died on Sunday September 3 at age 90. At the *New York Times*, David Orr and Dinitia Smith remember Ashbery, who published twenty-eight poetry collections, won all major American book prizes, and is considered by many to be the preeminent poet of his generation. "If some poets remind us of the richness of American poetry by blending seamlessly into one of its many traditions, Mr. Ashbery has frequently seemed like a tradition unto himself. It is a cliché to praise a writer by saying no one has ever sounded quite like him, and yet: No one has ever sounded quite like him

The big-hearted JJ Watt, a former Wisconsin Badger turned NFL Superstar, is bound and determined to make sure victims are helped directly as well.

In Houston, Salvation Army is also on the ground — just as they were during 9/11 — handing out dry clothes and water to first responders and victims.
